Established in 1988, Centre for international health (CIH) at the University of Bergen (UiB) is an interfaculty centre for research and training within the field of global health.



To provide excellent global health research and training contributing to improved health and equitable societies.

MISSION

CIH works in partnerships with research institutions in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), and aims to:

- Coordinate and conduct high quality, relevant and innovative global health research
- Teach, supervise, and facilitate learning in global health
- Disseminate research and engage in policy discussions on pertinent global health issues

GLOBAL HEALTH

In accordance with Sustainable Development Goal 3 (SDG3), the CIH defines global health as an area of research, education and practice aimed at improving health and achieving health equity for all people, with a particular focus on public health problems in LMICs. The field of global health promotes interdisciplinary collaboration and involves disciplines both within and beyond the health sciences. For CIH, mutual post-graduate capacity strengthening and genuine partnerships with implementing institutions are integrated and essential features of global health, in compliance with SDG4 and SDG17.

PARTNERSHIP


CIH aims to strengthen capacity in global health through research and training in partnership with academic institutions and other research entities in LMICs. An important prerequisite for establishing mutual and sustainable research partnerships is that projects are conceived, developed and implemented as a genuine collaborative effort.

SCIENTIFIC PRIORITIES

CIH commits to the SDG agenda with particular emphasis on health in LMIC. The main priorities are to work on the 'unfinished agenda'; the leading social, environmental and political determinants of the burden of disease in LMIC, including maternal, adolescent and child health, infectious diseases, and nutrition/growth. Priority will also be given to non-communicable diseases and injuries, in particular chronic respiratory diseases and mental health, as well as to research on health policy, health systems and health consequences of migration, climate changes and inequality. CIH will prioritize research on implementation and interventions that cost-effectively and equitably can improve health.

ETHIOPIA – A LONG-TERM PARTNER COUNTRY FOR CIH

Ever since the Armauer Hansen Research Institute (AHRI) was founded in 1969, there has been a close connection between the institute and the University of Bergen (UiB). UiB has developed several other partners in Ethiopia, and CIH has cooperated with partner institutions in Ethiopia since the start of CIH in 1988. Ethiopia is a country we give priority to, and we are grateful for the good cooperation we have with researchers there. CIH has many projects in Ethiopia, and below you can read about two of these.

Educating and training professional staff and future leaders in Southern Ethiopia- SENUPH-II

This project will expand previously started capacity-building activity at Hawassa University and in addition include Arba Minch and Dilla Universities in Southern Ethiopia. The project will focus on enhanced training of health research personnel, including leadership and management, and engage in research to assess and reduce the burden of disease. The project will incorporate evidence- based priority-setting research to ensure that the results enhance public health and ensure equity. The project will develop PhD and post doc research, and also train students at the master's level. The focus will be to strengthen the ownership, capability, and sustainability of the training programme at the universities working with the Ministry of Health to establish evidence-based healthcare.

Neurosurgery in Ethiopia

This project is a cooperation between Black Lion Hospital in Ethiopia, Addis Ababa University in Ethiopia, Haukeland University Hospital and Department of Clinical Medicine and CIH at the University of Bergen. This is a great example of cooperation including practice as well as scientific work in capacity building.


The goal is to establish an education program in neurosurgery and a sustainable neurosurgical offer to patients in Ethiopia, through education of specialists and training of nurses in anesthesia, intensive care and surgery. In addition, PhD candidates are included in the project.

UGANDA

Makerere University is Uganda's largest and one of East Africa's oldest and leading universities. The collaboration between Makerere University and the University of Bergen dates to 1988. CIH has been a part of this collaboration since the start of CIH and has later developed a cooperation with several other institutions in the country as well. We give two examples of projects in Uganda.

Award

Professor Thorkild Tylleskär and his PhD candidates Nicolas J. Pejovic and Susanna Myrnerts Höök received the award 'Publication of the year' in 2021, based on this article from studies in Uganda: A Randomized Trial of Laryngeal Mask Airway in Neonatal Resuscitation", published in New England Journal of Medicine. This was a large, randomized phase III clinical trial that compared using a supraglottic device versus standard face-mask ventilation in the resuscitation of newborn infants in a large referral hospital in Kampala, Uganda. Over 1100 newborns were included. Neonates who had breathing difficulties (needed positive pressure ventilation) at birth were divided into two groups. One received the standard face-mask ventilation, the other, ventilation using a laryngeal mask airway (LMA). The results showed that LMA could safely be used by midwifes but there was no difference in the survival rates between the two treatment groups – both treatments were equally effective.

TREAT Child Alcohol Use Disorder (C-AUD) in Eastern Uganda: Screening, diagnostics, risk factors and handling of children drinking alcohol

This project started in 2019 and the objective is to investigate the magnitude of C-AUD and substance use in children, and related household, community, school, health system and clinical factors associated with the disorder, and suggest scalable changes in the health system for screening, diagnostic and treatment procedures in Uganda. The project is a cooperation between CIH and Makerere University, Institute of Psychiatry at NTNU, as well as with Department of Clinical Medicine at UiB.

The effect of vitamin B12 supplementation on growth and neurodevelopment in Nepali children after one and two years – extended follow up

This study is a follow-up of an ongoing randomized placebocontrolled trial. In total, 600 Nepalese children were enrolled at age 6-11 months, and half of them received $2\mu g$ of vitamin B12 supplementation daily for 1 year. The trial aims to assess improvements in neurodevelopment and growth after one and two years after the end of supplementation. It will provide information expanding on that being provided by the CISMAC study on vitamin B12 supplementation during pregnancy. These studies combined will be the most comprehensive study on the effects of vitamin

B12 supplementation throughout the most vulnerable period of life. The results can be used to guide national and international nutrition recommendations. Partner institution is Tribhuvan University in Nepal. This is a CISMAC study.

CISMAC

A centre in our centre

Established in 2013, the Centre of Excellence, "the Centre for Intervention Science in Maternal and Child Health (CISMAC)", conducts research to improve maternal, newborn and child health (MNCH) in low and middle-income countries. CISMAC is a collaborative research consortium with partner institutions in Norway, Ethiopia, India, Nepal, Pakistan, South Africa, Uganda and Zambia, and works closely with the World Health Organization (WHO). The Centre develops and tests promising interventions and helps translate their research findings into policy and practice.

CISMAC has undertaken more than 20 studies spanning a variety of priority MNCH topics in Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa. Several of these studies are generating important spin-off projects, which are providing valuable opportunities



for young CISMAC researchers to develop their knowledge and skills, enabling them to become health intervention and implementation scientists.

All CISMAC's studies address important knowledge gaps and are providing high quality scientific information on which policy makers can use for evidence-based decisions

Strengthening Agency & Learning across Health Systems in the Americas (SALHSA)

This project is a partnership between the University of Bergen (UiB), the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana (PUJ) in Colombia and the Centre for the Study of State and Society (CEDES) in Argentina. It is part of the NORHED-II programme.

The aim of the project is to professionalize a new generation of leaders in the field of Health Policy & Systems Research (HPSR) that represent the region's Public and Global Health bodies, Universities, and the region's vibrant Civil Society in order to build stronger and more resilient health systems in Latin America.

NETWORKING

EUROPEAN CONGRESS ON TROPICAL MEDICINE AND INTERNATIONAL HEALTH 2021

In September 2021, the University of Bergen organized the 12th European Congress on Tropical Medicine and International Health (ECTMIH-2021). The congress was hosted in Norway for the first time. The topic was: Global challenges in health, migration, and equity, and it was a 4-day event.

The congress is a biannual, interdisciplinary event, and is held in agreement with the Federation of European Societies for Tropical Medicine and International Health (FESTMIH). The organization of the event in Bergen included people from Faculty of Medicine (all departments), Social Sciences, Psychology, Law and Art, Music, and Design at UiB, and many people from other Norwegian institutions. Centre for International Health, UiB, was responsible for the event, with great help and support from the UiB strategy area Global Challenges. The congress had 1249 attendees, 443 presentations (poster and oral) and-29 organized sessions. Ninetyfour countries participated, among them 31 low-and middle-income countries.

There was a high technical and scientific activity among the organizers, located in Grieghallen in Bergen to make this online event possible.


