SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Presentations must be made in **English**.
- The topic may be relevant to one of the subthemes described above, but S.Net is also open to any contribution which fit in the general theme of the conference.
- Submitted papers should indicate which subtheme is relevant.
- Individual presentations will typically be 20 minutes, followed by a 10 minutes
 question period. Note however that S.Net is open to proposals for other
 non-traditional contributions, such as roundtables, panel debate, workshop etc.
 as described in the call. Please specify the length of the contribution and, if
 applicable, how many participants can be included in the event.
- In submitting a proposal, the author(s) agree that the abstract may be published among other documents associated with the S.Net Conference 2016, Bergen, Norway.
- Proposals/abstracts must be submitted by the registration link. Proposals submitted by any other means will not be considered.
- A short one-paragraph bio for each author, indicating relevant expertise and interest in the topic should be submitted in the 'author' field of the registration link

SELECTION CRITERIA

Submissions will be evaluated by an international, multidisciplinary scientific committee. Principal criteria for selection will be:

- Quality of the abstract
- Relevance to the general theme and, more specifically, to the subthemes described in the *Theme* section

Corresponding author(s) will be notified of acceptance/rejection by **March 23rd**Authors whose proposals are selected are expected to pay their registration fees by **August 1th 2016** at the latest
