GLOBVAC

GLOBVAC

The thematic areas are:

- Prevention and treatment of, and diagnostics for, communicable diseases.
- Family planning, reproductive, maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health.
- Health systems and health policy research.
- Innovation in technology and methods development.

In addition:

- Implementation research can be included under all four thematic areas.
- Research that sheds light on new questions and challenges related to the transition from the Millennium Development Goals to the Sustainable Development Goals is encouraged

GLOBVAC

Eligibility

- Only Norwegian research institutions may submit the application and be the formal Project Owner
- Projects are encouraged to include project managers from (low- and lower-middle income countries (LLMICs) as principal investigators on applications.
- Projects managers from LLMICs must then collaborate with the Norwegian research institution which is the formal Project Owner.

GLOBVAC

Budget

- The programme will fund large-scale projects of maximum NOK 20 million as well as smaller projects of minimum NOK 5 million.
- Co-funding is encouraged. Co-funding in this call can include: cash financing and/or in-kind resources such as personnel, research infrastructure, materials, etc. provided by the project owner, national partner institutions/organizations, international partner institutions/organizations (including EU's research programmes) and public sector or other public sources.

Minimum duration (months): 36. Maximum duration (months): 60

GLOBVAC

Key assessment criteria

- Scientific merit (internationally competitive research proposals with solid methodology)
- Project management and the Project group
- Implementation plan and resources
- International collaboration
- User involvement
- Anticipated benefits
- Relevance to the call for proposals

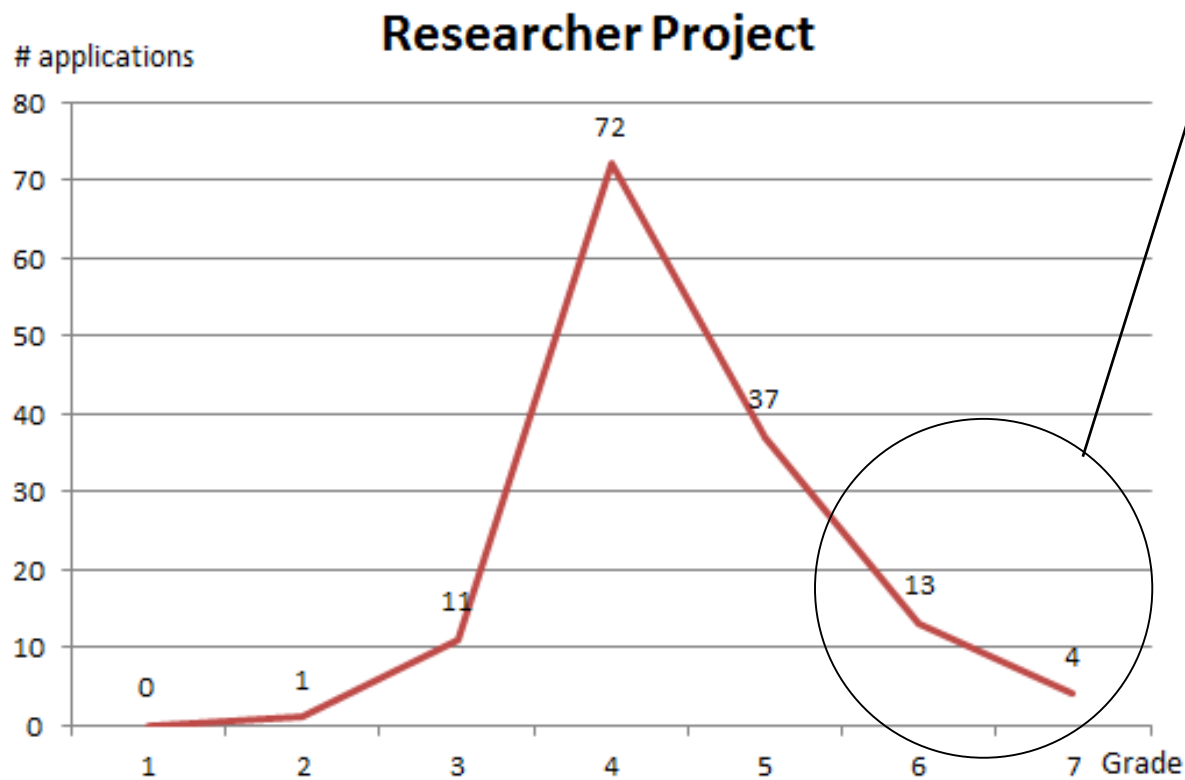

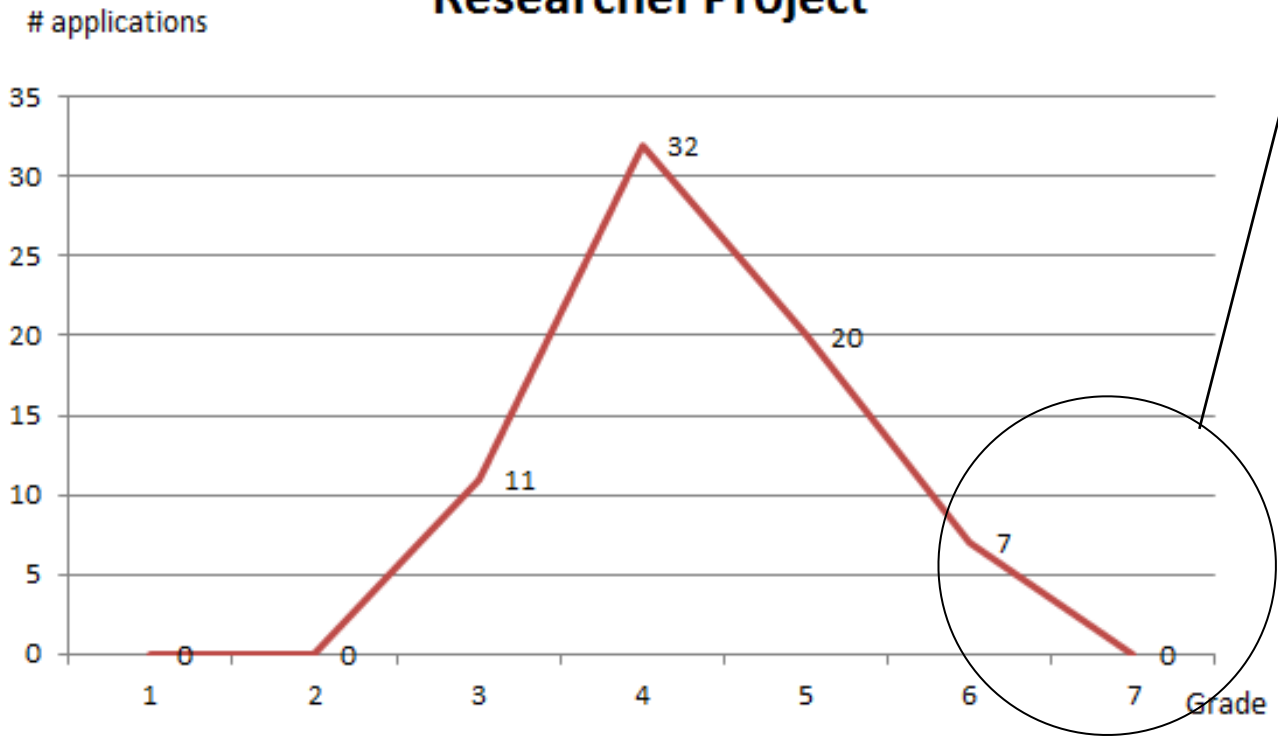

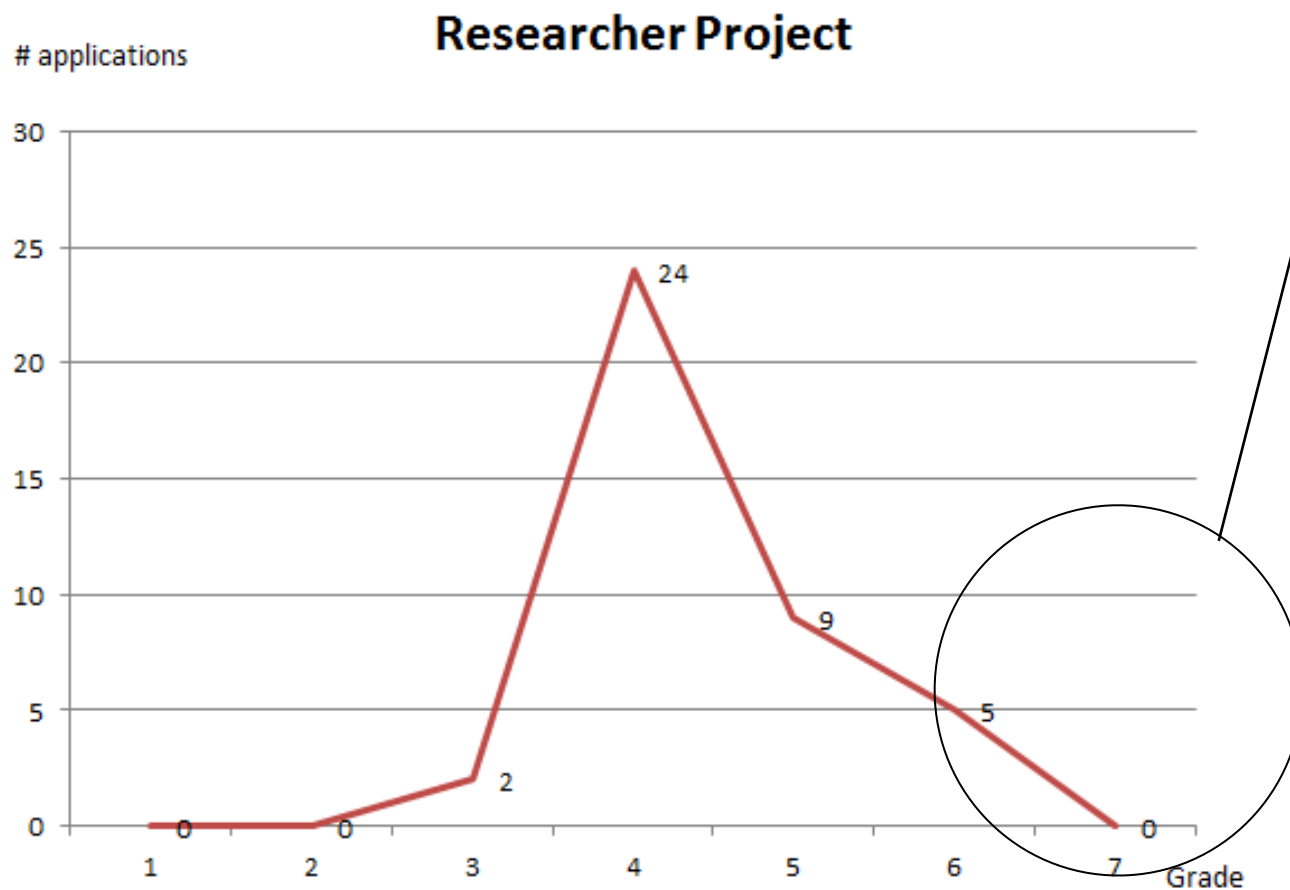

BEDREHELSE

Up to 150 million kroner for **environmental support for research** on better public health.

This announcement differs from the announcement of funding for research projects and other project support. Environmental support **is a strategic instrument** where the goal is **to strengthen quality and capacity within the program's target area.**

- In assessing applications, emphasis will be placed on **method development and national, Nordic and international cooperation.**
- Applying institutions **must** themselves **contribute with self-financing** and make a plan for **continuation** after the funding has been completed by the Research Council.
- For environmental support, a total of 30-50 million kroner can be applied over a five-year period.
- NOK 50 million is only granted on special well-founded needs.

BEHANDLING

NOK 115 million for researcher projects

Open for applications in the width of the program plan.

Applications for funding of **intervention studies** that **combine clinical data with health data in existing registries and / or biobanks** will be prioritized



HELSEVEL

NOK 100 million for researcher projects

Open to applications in the width of the program plan, but the announcement will describe some themes and issues that will be given special priority.

FRIPRO

The FRIPRO scheme seeks to increase **international mobility** among researchers in the early stages of their careers, and to help Norwegian applicants compete successfully in international funding schemes. It is therefore expected that:

- research fellows in FRIPRO projects will incorporate **a stay abroad into their fellowship period**,
- project managers of funded *Researcher Projects* and *Young Research Talents* projects **will apply for grants from the European Research Council (ERC)**.

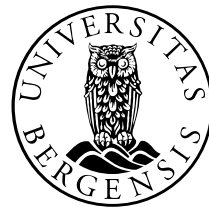
The research institutions are requested to contribute to a good gender balance among project managers.

FRIPRO

Application type	Requirements related to the project manager	Project duration	Amount sought
Researcher Project	At least 6 years since the date of defence of an approved doctorate	Up to 4 years	NOK 5-10 mill.
Young Research Talents	2-8 years since the date of defence of an approved doctorate, you must be younger than 40 years old, may apply for this application type up to three times and receive funding only once	Up to 4 years	NOK 4-8 mill.
FRIPRO Mobility Grants	0-6 years since the date of defence of an approved doctorate	3 years (2 abroad and 1 in Norway)	Up to approx. NOK 3.5 mill.
Support for Events	-	The conference must be held the year after the deadline	Up to NOK 250.000
