Although online meetings often are good and useful, it is necessary to meet each other in person from time to time. Also, we were very happy to see our students coming back to campus in the autumn. STRATEGY 2021-2025

Established in 1988, Centre for international health (CIH) at the University of Bergen (UiB) is an interfaculty centre for research and training within the field of global health. In 2021/2022 we had a major discussion about our future, and ended up with this text:

VISION

To provide excellent global health research and training contributing to improved health and equitable societies.

MISSION

CIH works in partnerships with research institutions in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) and aims to:

• Coordinate and conduct high quality, relevant and innovative global health research

• Teach, supervise, and facilitate learning in global health

• Disseminate research and engage in policy discussions on pertinent global health issues

GLOBAL HEALTH

In accordance with Sustainable Development Goal 3 (SDG3), the CIH defines global health as an area of research, education and practice aimed at improving health and achieving health equity for all people, with a particular focus on public health problems in LMICs. The field of global health promotes interdisciplinary collaboration and involves disciplines both within and beyond the health sciences. For CIH, mutual post-graduate capacity strengthening and genuine partnerships with implementing institutions are integrated and essential features of global health, in compliance with SDG4 and SDG17.

PARTNERSHIP

CIH aims to strengthen capacity in global health through research and training in partnership with academic institutions and other research entities in LMICs. An important prerequisite for establishing mutual and sustainable research partnerships is that projects are conceived, developed and implemented as a genuine collaborative effort.

SCIENTIFIC PRIORITIES


CIH commits to the SDG agenda with particular emphasis on health in LMIC. The main priorities are to work on the 'unfinished agenda'; the leading social, environmental, and political determinants of the burden of disease in LMIC, including maternal, adolescent and child health, infectious diseases, and nutrition/growth. Priority will also be given to non-communicable diseases and injuries, in particular chronic respiratory diseases and mental health, as well as to research on health policy, health systems and health consequences of migration, climate changes and inequality.

CIH will prioritize research on implementation and interventions that cost-effectively and equitably can improve health.

COUNTRY PRESENTATIONS

Centre for International Health has many partner institutions, in many countries. We work with capacity building of different kinds, in research as well as education. Here we present our activities in three of the countries: Tanzania, Rwanda, and Democratic Republic of Congo. The countries are chosen randomly, next year we will present others.

TANZANIA



Over the years, many researchers at CIH have had the pleasure of working together with partners in Tanzania. CIH started up due to an active policy from the University of Bergen; to work on global challenges and to work together with partners in relevant countries. The University Director at this time, Magne Lerheim, had been working in Tanzania. Clearly, this inspired several researchers to establish contacts and partnerships in this country. Still, researchers at CIH have projects with Tanzanian partners:

Safeworkers

In this project, Professors Bente E. Moen and Magne Bråtveit aim to develop a Virtual school of Occupational Health with their partners in Tanzania and Ethiopia. The project is titled *Safe Work Conditions by Innovative Research and Education*.

Researchers at Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences (MUHAS), Tanzania, Addis Ababa University (AAU), Ethiopia, and University of Bergen (UiB) have collaborated in various research and capacity-building activities within Occupational Health since 2003.

The project groups now want to expand their efforts, cooperating more closely with governmental organizations, disseminating results more widely, having a greater societal impact, and influencing policy development in these 2 countries and other countries in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA). This is a NORHED-2, Norad-funded project.

Strengthen Health Economics

The NORPART project *Strengthen Health Economics Capacity at Bergen and MUHAS* is run by Bjarne Robberstad in cooperation with Amani Thomas Mori. This project is a collaboration between CIH and the Department of Development Studies at MUHAS, Tanzania.

Network partner institutions include the Ministry of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children in Tanzania and the University of Oslo (UiO) in Norway.

The main focus of the project is to strengthen institutional capacity and the education programme in Health Economics at the Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences (MUHAS), Tanzania. It is also to develop a well-established collaboration between MUHAS and the University of Bergen (UiB).

The project activities consist of reviewing and harmonization of curricula, development of MSc. Health Policy majoring in Health Economics programme; development of a joint course; joint teaching and supervision of students including guest lecturing. Mobility of 30 students travelling between Norway and Tanzania is possible. The project started in 2017 and was delayed due to the pandemic. It will likely continue the whole 2023.

MATRISET- Facilitating «real life» implementation of MDSR

We have received funding from the Research Council of Norway for a new project: *MATRISET - Reporting in context: An interdisciplinary initiative to strengthen maternal health services and surveillance in Ethiopia and Tanzania.* The Maternal Death Surveillance and Response System (MDSR) is a tool to enhance maternal mortality reporting and corrective action.

The aim of the project is to strengthen reporting in maternal mortality surveillance systems to ensure relevant response in the contexts of Ethiopia and Tanzania.

The project is carried out by an interdisciplinary research group from the social sciences, law, and medicine. Through a combination of ethnography, survey, and analysis of register data, we investigate the relationship between observed and reported clinical practice. The project leader is Professor Astrid Blystad.

Rwanda



CIH does not have a long history of activities in Rwanda.

However, in 2018 Theogene Habumugisha from Rwanda was granted a PhD scholarship to work on the topic '*Nutrition policy and food systems recommendations anchored in the Sustainable Development Goals and Responsible Research and Innovation frameworks: Is that a possibility?*'

He started his work in the COVID-19 pandemic, performing his fieldwork in Rwanda, He is a part of the scientific group at CIH.

His supervisors are from 3 faculties: Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences and Faculty of Humanities.

Water ESSENCE

is a NORHED-2, Norad-funded project that work with activities on co-development and improvement of skills, knowledge, tools, and other resources of the partner universities needed for the education of higher quality graduates of water-related study programs, conducting more and higher quality water research, and increasing their inclusiveness.

Several partners are involved, and among these we find the University of Rwanda. Tore Sætersdal at CIH/Global Challenges priority area at UiB is the project leader.

The project has 2 Norwegian partners and 8 African partners.

iCARTA – Institutionalization of Advanced research training in Africa

From CIH, Thorkild Tylleskär and Anne Berit Kolmannskog, participated in a meeting in a meeting in the CARTA -University of Rwanda partnership forum, held in Rwanda in September this year.

CARTA stands for Consortium for Advanced Research Training in Africa. The University of Rwanda (UR) is one of CARTA's eight African Partner Universities. To date, there are 24 CARTA fellows at UR (8 graduates and 16 in progress).

CIH manages a project related to CARTA, called iCARTA – Institutionalization of Advanced research training in Africa.

This is a NORHED-2, Norad-funded project. UiB has partnered with CARTA network to build an African academy capable of leading world-class, multidisciplinary research to improve public and population health. The Consortium aims to produce high-quality early career researchers (ECRs).

Also, this year, the Nordic ambassador of Rwanda, Dr. Diane Gashumba visited CIH, and we enjoyed her company for one day.

Democratic Republic of Congo - DRC



The Centre for International Health has run projects in DRC for many years, and several researchers at CIH are familiar with this country. At present we have two projects here, one for research and one for mobility:

Developing a cadre of African nutrition scholars and leaders to address nutrition disorders and influence nutrition policy (GROWNUT-2)

The GROWNUT-2 project is a NORHED-2 project, funded by Norad. The project aims to address the shortage of research capacity to inform the development of locally relevant, evidence-based policies in two low-income countries, using nutrition as the vehicle for capacity building.

The project will develop and support postgraduate training in nutritional epidemiology in Tanzania and DRC, building on the success of a previous project: GROWNUT-1. project in DRC. The plan is to develop a blended learning package in nutritional epidemiology that will be implemented in the two sites. It will also involve post-graduate student research linked to a demand-driven locally relevant research agenda in each country. The project partnership is strongly linked to the Ministry of Health in both countries. The goal is to support and develop African nutrition researchers as well as a locally produced body of high-quality research to inform nutrition policy in Tanzania and DRC.

Three CIH Professors will be involved in GROWNUT II, professors Anne Hatløy, Ingunn Engebretsen, and Thorkild Tylleskär. The project will be implemented in Tanzania and the Democratic Republic of Congo and will have collaborating partners from South Africa.

Enhanced partnership for research capacity of next generation of nutrition researchers in Norway, Tanzania and DRC (ENTREPENUT)

This is a NORPART project, funded by the Ministry of Education and Research and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. NORPART shall enhance the quality of higher education in Norway and selected partner countries in the Global South through academic cooperation and mutual student mobility.

The overall aim of the EPRENUT program is to enhance partnership for research capacity of next generation of nutrition researchers in Norway, Tanzania, and DRC through implementing students' mobility, strengthened curricula and teaching, and dissemination of research output for national and global sustainable development.

In 2022, it was difficult to organize meetings in DRC, due to the COVID-19 pandemic as well as due to general restrictions in obtaining

VISA. It was also difficult for people from DRC to obtain VISA for travels abroad. Therefore, the communication was mainly digital in 2022,

and the photos are from a meeting in January 2023. Finally, the researchers could meet!

CISMAC

A centre of excellence located at CIH

The Centre for Intervention Science in Maternal and Child Health (CISMAC) conducts research to improve maternal, new-born and child health (MNCH) in low and middle-income countries. We evaluate promising interventions and help translate research findings into policy and practice. CISMAC is a collaborative research consortium with partners in Norway, Ethiopia, India, Nepal, Pakistan, South Africa, Uganda, and Zambia, and works closely with the World Health Organization (WHO).

CISMAC was established in 2013 and its portfolio of studies is expanding. Currently, we have 24 studies that span a variety of priority MNCH topics and are implemented in Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa.

CISMAC covers a wide range of interventions addressing important global health challenges, from BCG vaccination of infants born to HIVinfected mothers, impact of communityinitiated Kangaroo Mother Care (ci-KMC) in low-birth-weight babies, improving postnatal care, to studies on economic support and empowerment of adolescent girls to reduce the risk of teenage childbearing and fostering entrepreneurship.



CISMAC studies address important knowledge gaps and provide high quality scientific information which policy makers can use to make evidence-based decisions.

CISMAC has been funded by the Norwegian Research Council (RCN) since 2013, ongoing for 10 years. CISMAC will continue with a nocost extension until August 2025.

The CISMAC Director is Professor Halvor Sommerfelt.



NETWORK INCLUDING UKRAINE



CIH is taking part in an ERASMUS+ project titled 'Building Academic Capacity in Global Health in the Eastern Europe-Central Asia Region', with the abbreviation BACE. The aim of this project is to enable 3 countries in the Eastern Europe - Central Asia region: Georgia, Ukraine, and Kazakhstan, to build capacity and integrate global health into their academic programme. We have established the Eurasian Academic Alliance for Global Health (EAAGH) and had an online meeting in September 2022 in this alliance.

Despite the war, partners from Ukraine participated. People in Kiev told us about how it is to teach global health in a city with frequent bombing. We are very impressed by their ability to cope with a very difficult situation and to continue teaching global health – no matter what happens.

CIH – CISMAC RESEARCH SCHOOL

The activity in the research school this year has mainly been online. A total of 11 webinars have been conducted this year. These normally take place once a month, the first Wednesday 12:30-14:00. The topics of these seminars have mainly been on maternal and child health. A great deal of the webinars has been led by young researchers and we strive to facilitate a stimulating and engaging place to share, teach and learn high quality science. The webinars are popular, and several of them have attracted more than 50 participants.

In addition, the research school has organized the Midway evaluation for seven PhD candidates, all were online this year. The seminars revealed that the pandemic has caused delay for many projects, and several of our PhD candidates had to ask for extension of their PhD period due to this.

Nordic Global Health Talks

Our PhD candidates have also been invited to *Nordic Global Health Talks*. This is a monthly webinar series about global health from the Nordic universities. The first Thursday of each month at 10.00 am CET, we can join on Zoom and listen to an interesting global health lecture from a Nordic university. It is free and open to everyone interested in knowing more about Nordic global health research, education, and collaborative projects. Nordic Global Health Talks is organised by Nordic Network on Global Health that CIH is a part of.

Norwegian Research School of Global Health

The PhD candidates have also had the possibility to be a member of the Norwegian Research School of Global Health (NRSGH). This is a research school which has been funded by the Research Council of Norway, so funding for travels and accommodation has been granted. The NRSGH has organized several events in 2022, for instance courses in Systematic review and meta-analysis, Innovation in Global Health, Scientific Writing and Advanced Epidemiology. Our PhD candidates have appreciated these possibilities and participated in these events.



Activities not counted at UiB

CIH performs several activities that are highly appreciated by the University of Bergen, as they belong to the activities counted for UiB production and reporting back to the Ministry of Education and Research.

However, CIH also performs many teaching activities in other countries, beside the research projects. Many of these activities are not registered at UiB, they are just mentioned in project reports. For instance, CIH supervises 21 PhD candidates not enrolled at UiB, as you may see in the figure below. This kind of supervision is performed by Karen M. Moland, Astrid Blystad, Tehmina Mustafa, Ingvild Fossgard Sandøy, Bente E. Moen, Ingunn M. S. Engebretsen and Halvor Sommerfelt. In addition, the CIH staff supervise 5 master students enrolled at other universities, and ten of the CIH researchers report substantial teaching in courses at other institutions. Also, mentoring of post doctors is performed by CIH staff in many countries.

The work mentioned here is very important for our partner institutions, and it is admirable that the CIH staff can contribute to provide our colleagues and students in other countries with their knowledge and expertise. We wish the Ministry and UiB leadership also would put weight on this type of work.

EDUCATION AT CIH

Master programme in global health

The programme has been revised and changed on several aspects this year. In the spring semester we had several hybrid courses (with students both online and on campus), which was a great technical challenge for us all. However, both teachers and students discussed the challenges and improved the activities when it was necessary. We also had a higher number of students (39) compared to normal years, and it was challenging to find supervisors for all.

CIH was helped by several researchers in our surrounding environment, and we are very

grateful for this support. In the autumn, 20 new students started up. We had on campus teaching only, and both students and teachers enjoyed being physically present again. In the autumn methodological course, we experienced a high number of failures at the exam (30%), so we are considering establishing a preparatory course for the next group of students and prolong the course period with one week. We experience a good communication between students and teachers, and we are all eager to improve the study programme.




Bibliometric – Global Challenges

One of the 3 priority areas at University of Bergen is Global Challenges. The other 2 are Climate and Marine activity. The activity at CIH belongs to Global Challenges. Senior Academic Librarian Caroline Armitage at the UiB library has studied the publications from this priority area the past years and made the report 'Bibliometrisk kartlegging av satsningsområdene ved UiB, November 2022'. 
At UiB, 29% of the publications come from the 3 priority areas, as shown in the figure below.

The publication trend shows that the percentage of publications at UiB on Global Challenges is between 9 to 12, with a small increase.



Global challenges developed a list of search terms for the library, focused on the three topics Migration, global health and inequality. See the report for details on the search terms. The percentage of publications from global health was 66, from inequality 57 and 15 from migration. A large number of publications within global health comes from the Faculty of Medicine, as you see from the figure below.




