The grant is reserved for students attending Norwegian universities and university colleges. The aim of the grant is to support activity and academic environment at the Norwegian Institute at Athens, within the humanities, social sciences, and other disciplines with a connection to Greece. Emphasis will be placed on the academic quality of the project, relevance for the institute, including networking and recruitment. The recipient of the Athenæum grant is expected to present their work at a seminar or similar at the Norwegian Institute at Athens during the stay.

In 2021, the board will grant one stipend of NOK 15,000.

The application must contain: a CV, academic transcript, project description (not more than one typed page), budget for the project with information about other sources of finance (if applicable) and name and contact information for the candidate's supervisor.

The grant will be awarded by June 21, 2021. The funds must be used within one year of its award. A report must be sent to the board of Athenæum, at the latest three months after travel.
