ORAL CANCER IN SUDAN



The Johannessen group has a clear vision of the need to collaborate with researchers in the countries where oral cancer is the biggest burden. Therefore they have selected three countries: India, Nepal and Sudan. Recently, the group went to Khartoum, Sudan, to follow up on a longstanding collaboration on oral cancer between Bergen and Khartoum. We asked Anne C. (Tine) Johannessen to tell us a little about the collaboration.

The UiB-Khartoum relationship dates back 55 years, Tine explains. Now oral cancer is a large field of collaboration, as the use of smokeless tobacco is strongly embedded in the Sudanese culture, leading to oral cancer as a substantial social burden. Sudanese PhD candidates are training at UiB with the goal to build up a platform of research competence in their home country.

CCBIO905 COURSE IN AUGUST











The CCBIO course "CCBIO905 - Methods in Cancer Biomarker Research" is now available for the fall term, August 27-29, 2018. This 5 ECTS credits course has focus on methods relevant for basic and translational cancer biomarker research.

The thematic parts include methods ranging from basic techniques on nucleotides and proteins to more advanced approaches, as well as bioinformatics and biobanking supplemented by presentations on ethics and economics of cancer biomarkers.

The students are acquired prepare group presentations on important scientific papers describing results from clinical trials that have led to approval of new cancer treatments.

Lars A. Akslen and Jim Lorens have the academic responsibility and Ingeborg Winge is the course coordinator. The course is primarily intended for PhD candidates who are affiliated with CCBIO, but is also open to other students, researchers and students attending the designated Medical Student Research Program.

NEW LEADER OF ONKOLOGISK FORUM


CCBIO's Associate Investigator Line Bjørge is from 01.01.18 the new leader of Onkologisk Forum.
