As 2013 has been CIH's 25th Anniversary Year, it is relevant to mention that the Centre has been led by five professors over the years. It is a challenge to ensure the continuation of their excellent work! It is fitting to acknowledge here the hard work and leadership of these men.

CIH started this year by being merged together with the Department of Public Health and Primary Health Care to become The Department of Global Public Health and Primary Care. These two units have had a joint administration since 2010. Now we face the challenge of balancing cooperation with the rest of the department with, at the same time, continuing to be CIH, a visible Centre with relations also to other Departments and Faculties at the University of Bergen and beyond.

2. CAPACITY BUILDING FOR 25 YEARS

Autumn 2013 the Centre for International Health (CIH) celebrated 25 years of working to improve health in developing countries.

A pioneer in development-related research CIH has emphasised capacity building in both research and higher education; trying to answer the question – how can we improve health service delivery in low- and middle-income countries? CIH research is cross-cutting, multi-disciplinary reaching across Departments, Faculties, Institutions and countries. An important focus has been prevention, particularly in the area of child and maternal health.

CIH has been involved with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Norwegian Ministry of Education to establish the Quota Programme to facilitate students from developing countries to come to Norway for graduate education opportunities not available in their home countries. Many of CIH's over 150 PhD and over 200 Master graduates have been Quota students.

When Professor Bjarne Bjorvatn was the first Centre Director in 1988, the focus was primarily Tropical Medicine. However, the need for a wider focus was recognized and CIH came into being.

Professors Rune Nilsen, Bernt Lindtjørn, Gunnar Kvåle and Knut Fylkesnes followed and CIH is now established with ten professorships (100%) as well as several other staff members with high competence.

CIH's high-quality, internationally competitive research is well documented. The research centre was classified as "excellent" in two external evaluations conducted by the Research Council of Norway (RCN) in 2003 and 2011. In 2012 CIH was awarded a Centre for Research Excellence from the RCN, the Centre for Intervention Science in Maternal and Child Health (CISMAC).

3. CENTRE FOR INTERVENTION SCIENCE IN MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH (CISMAC).

CISMAC will undertake “intervention studies” that will provide information on how to effectively and equitably improve maternal and child health.

The Centre officially opened in October 2013, as a Research Council of Norway (RCN) funded Centre of Excellence that will receive funding for 10 years. It is an international consortium based at the University of Bergen (UiB) and includes research institutions in Ethiopia, India, Nepal, South Africa, Uganda and Zambia. It also collaborates with the World Health Organisation (WHO), the Chr. Michelsen Institute and the Norwegian Institute of Public Health. The Centre will engage in research projects in Asia and sub-Saharan Africa.

Although global child mortality has decreased significantly since 1990, it is estimated that nearly 20 000 children under 5 continue to die every day. However, CISMAC leader Halvor

Sommerfelt says that the deaths are just the tip of the iceberg – many more survive, but are scarred for life.

It is estimated that two-thirds of these deaths are “preventable” through relatively simple interventions. CISMAC will implement and evaluate various interventions that aim to reduce the mortality numbers. The Centre will disseminate the findings to global and national Maternal, Newborn and Child Health programmes.

The Centre of Excellence funding gives research groups a real advantage because the long funding period enables them to undertake larger, longer-term projects and to be able to see the effects.

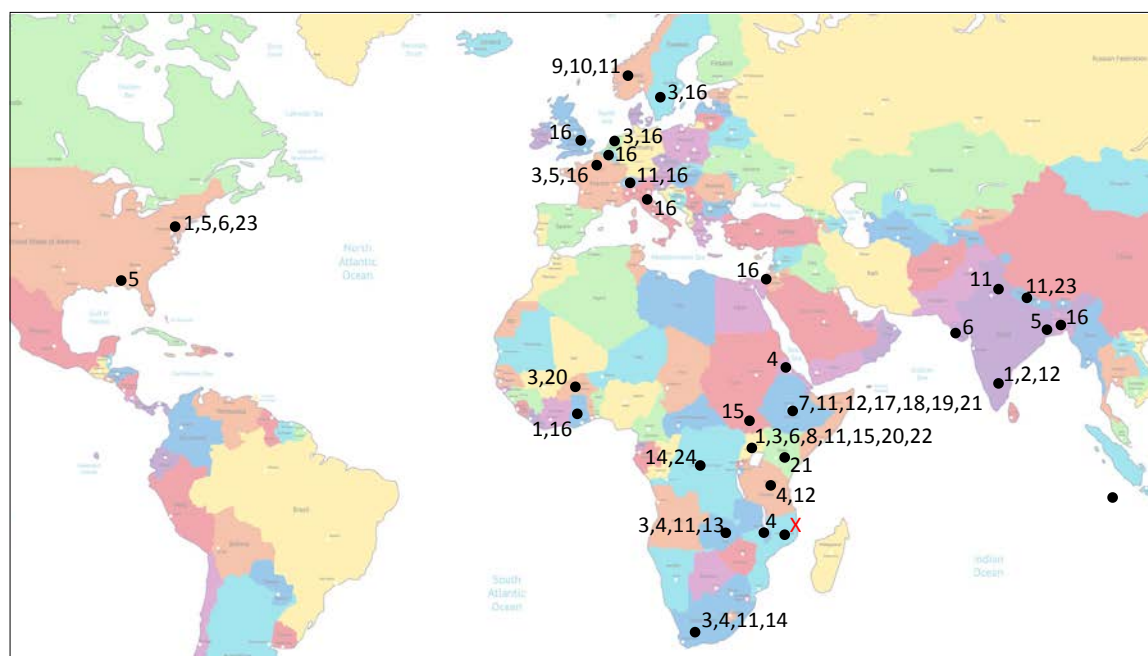

8. EDUCATION

Master in International Health

CIH has run three Master's programmes this year:

- Master in International Health
- Master of Philosophy in Oral Sciences
- The European Master of Science Programme in International Health

The first two are 2-year programmes (120 ECTS credits), and the students take much of the teaching together. The aim of the programmes is competence-building in low income countries. The degrees will give students deeper knowledge and research training in important subjects within fields related to international health. They are customised for each student and aim to reflect areas of high priority in the student's home region.

The various Master programmes offer a variety of research possibilities for student research projects. Each student is associated with a specific research group or group of scientists. Students may choose from the following areas: HIV/AIDS; Child Health and Nutrition; Maternal and Child Health; Tuberculosis; Global Health (Health Policy, Health Systems Research, Ethics, Health Economics, Culture; Occupational Health; Climate and Health; and Vaccines and Immunology

Global Health for medical students

All students are offered a week's course in Global Health, in the 6th year of the curriculum. In addition, CIH offers an elective course for committed medical students with the opportunity to focus on International Health issues through a concentrated period of exciting lectures and an eight-week field visit in India, Tanzania or South Africa.

Theoretical portion

The course begins with a 6-week series of lectures, where students receive an introduction to Global Health. Topics presented are public health, major global diseases, ethical issues and topics such as the interaction between health, politics and poverty. The students also receive an introduction into medical examination techniques, so they are equipped to deal with patients during the field stay.

Practical portion

After completing the theoretical portion of the course at UiB, the students visit the field at one of the partner institutions in India, Uganda, Tanzania or Sri Lanka. This part of the course consists of observations and practical training either in hospitals or clinics. Other activities may include visits to village centres, mobile clinics and mother-child clinics. During weekends the students have time off, and often have excursions.

Award-winning!

In 2011, CIH's Global Health course was awarded the Faculty's education award for the way it highlights the importance of the global aspects of medicine. The same year it was also awarded UiB's education award, the "Ugleprisen" (The Owl Award), presented to the UiB course deemed to have the highest academic quality.
