- Smart, sustainable and inclusive growth

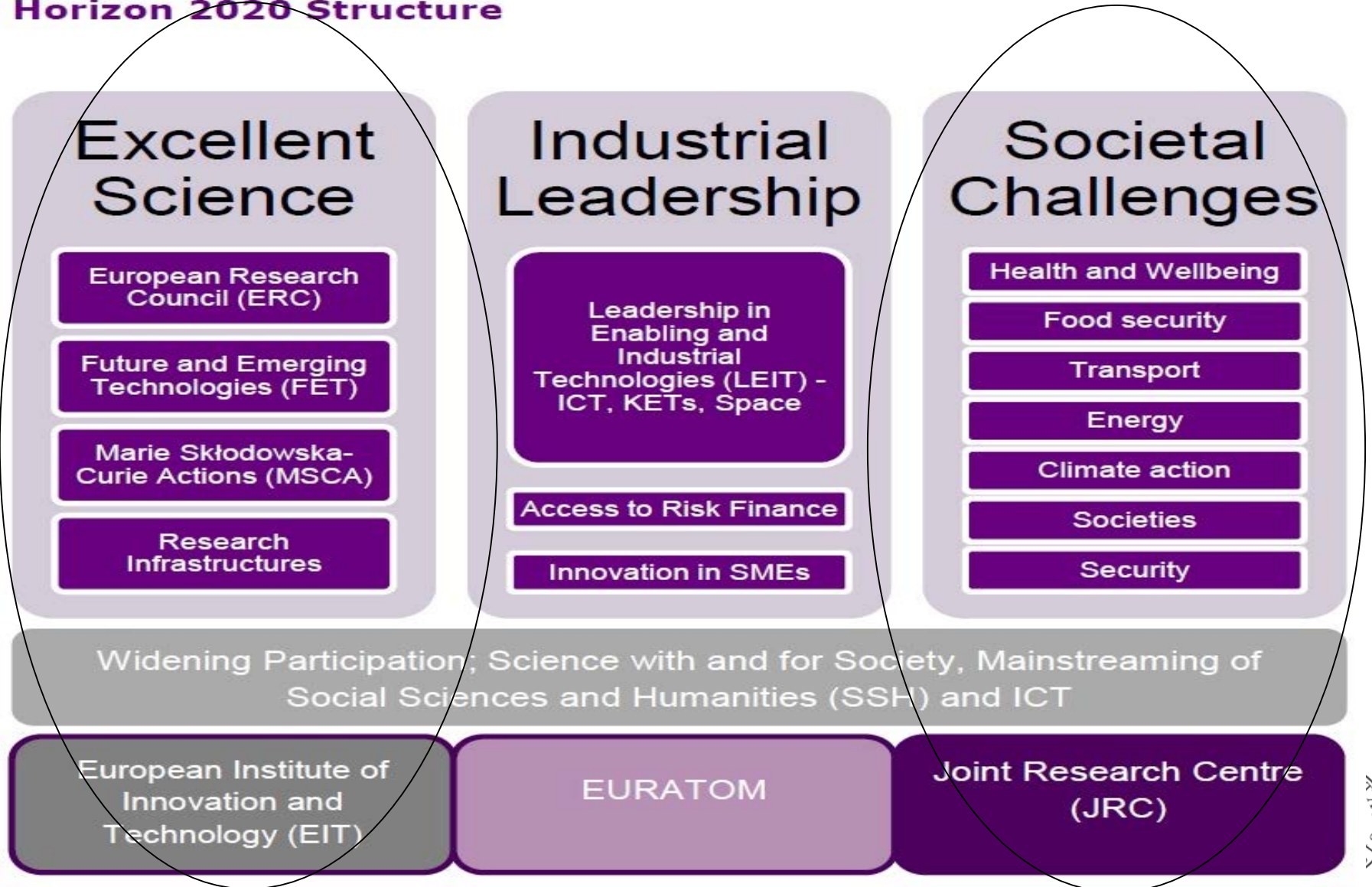
Key Drivers of the Strategy

- **An aging European population** – from 1 million over 60 years per year before year 2000 to more than 2 million per year after 2007

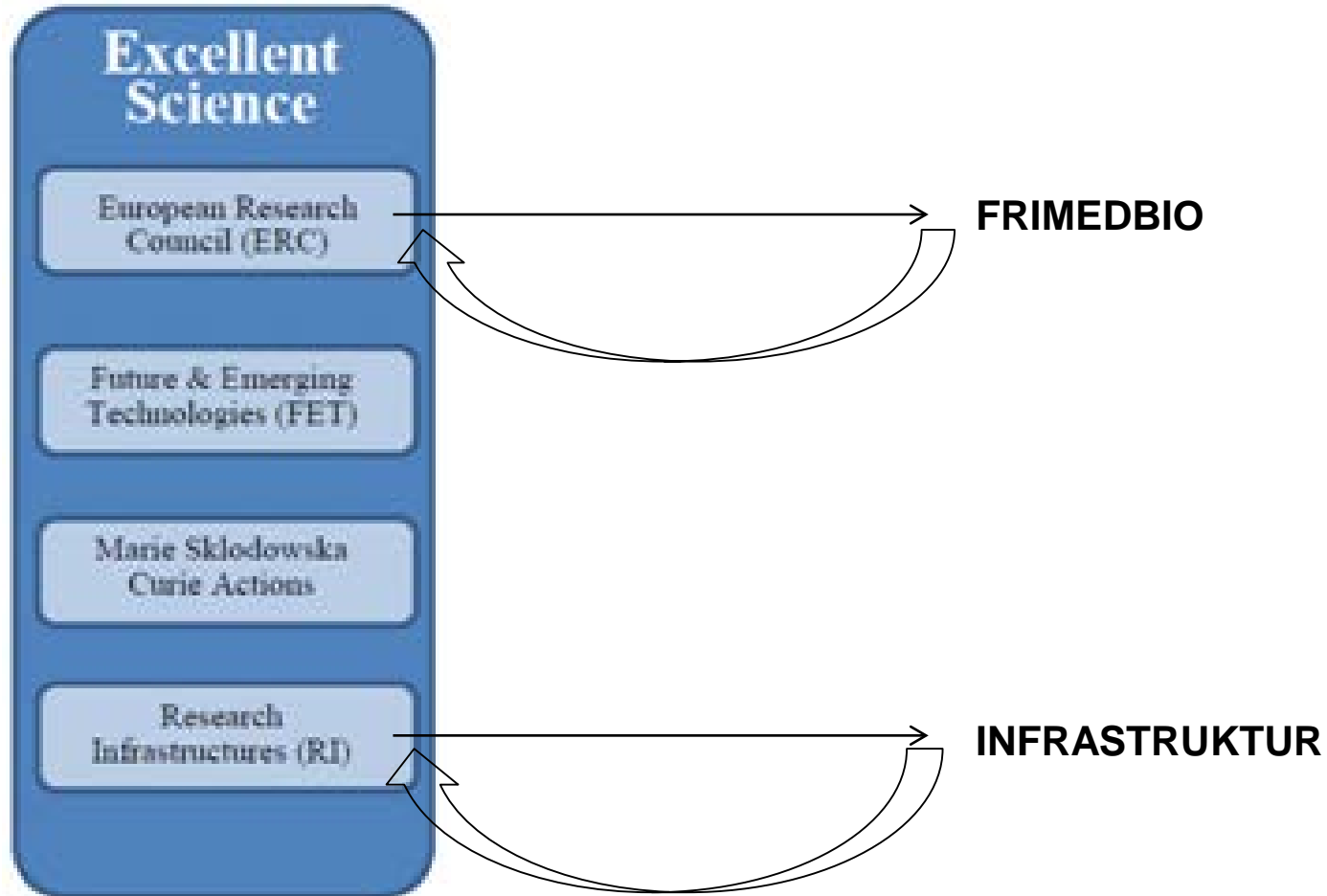


Horizon 2020 is the financial instrument to secure Europe's global competitiveness.

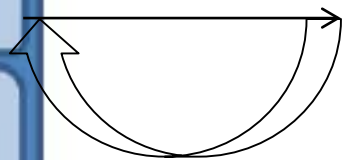
Horizon 2020 Structure

The Research Programme on High-quality and Reliable Diagnostics, Treatment and Rehabilitation

Main goal

BEHANDLING will support **clinical research activities** to help to ensure that **patients** receive high-quality and reliable diagnostics, treatment and rehabilitation throughout their disease trajectory.

*“time limited, planned processes with clear goals and instruments where several partners are working together to provide the necessary **assistance to the patient and the user's own efforts** to achieve the best possible functioning and coping ability, independence and participation socially and in society”*

NOK 60 million for research on the relationship between mental health disorders, alcohol and drug addiction, and/or somatic health problems

Application type: **Researcher project**


- Total budget 60 million NOK
- Up to 6 year project period
- **Minimum** applied amount **6 million** NOK
- Interdisciplinary collaboration across sectors and levels of health care
- User involvement
- Anticipated benefits

Thematic priority areas under the programme

- health and care services
- social and welfare services
- child welfare service
- integrated, coherent patient and user pathways

Services research and **service innovation** are the key components of the programme.

Up to NOK 50 million in funding for innovation in the health, care and welfare services

Application type: Innovation Project for the Public Sector

Up to NOK 50 million in funding to develop core groups and clusters

Applicants that have submitted a mandatory project outline by the deadline of 10 May 2016 are invited to submit grant applications to develop core groups and clusters in three key areas for the development of the health, care and welfare services.

Research programme on Welfare, Working Life and Migration

The VAM programme is seeking research projects that study various aspects of the **prerequisites for the welfare and working life model** in light of societal changes related to **migration, socioeconomic differences and greater diversity**.



VAM

Research programme on Welfare, Working Life and Migration

Application type: Researcher project

- Total budget 30 million NOK
- Up to 4 year project period
- **Minimum** applied amount **5 million** NOK, maximum **8 million** NOK

Applicants are encouraged to incorporate:

- Interdisciplinarity
- Gender and generation
- Perspectives from the humanities and legal studies
- Comparative perspectives

VAM

Research programme on Welfare, Working Life and Migration

Research areas

- Mechanisms that promote and undermine support for the **Norwegian welfare model**, from the majority population as well as from members of the immigrant population;
- **Norwegian immigration and integration policy** in light of international legal commitments;
- **Normative and ethical aspects of policy** in the field;
- **Changes in integration, competency and working life policy** resulting from increased migration and demographic shifts;
- Effects of measures related to **settlement and participation and integration in education, working life and civil society for newly arrived migrants.**





Call for proposals under the Nordic Programme on Health and Welfare: **Nordic Register-based Research Projects**

The research should address societal challenges and **use register data from combined data sources** (i.e. both socio-economic and health-related data). User involvement and perspectives should be taken into account.

Deadline 5 October 2016



NordForsk

Pre-announcement: **New instrument for Nordic university cooperation to be launched late 2016**

The new instrument will provide funding for **activities that facilitate co-operation within selected areas** of high quality, strengthening the excellence of the academic field and providing Nordic added value.

The budget for the call is MNOK 20. It is expected that 5-7 consortia of Nordic universities and/or university colleges that perform research will be funded.





Research Development Fund (RDF) 2016

The RDF offers grants of up to **£12,000** (average £10,000) to foster partnership in the network, including new members as a priority, and support research collaborations in the following WUN Global Challenges:

Public Health (non-communicable disease) – focusing in the 2016 round on life course approach to healthy ageing; **health of migrants** across the life course; **the resilience of adolescents and health workers** in different cultural contexts; and **schools** as a setting for reducing risk factors associated with NCDs.

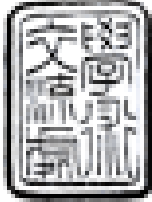

Inbound Research Mobility Scheme (2016-2017)

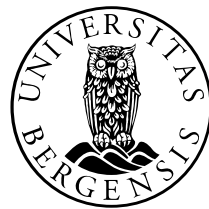
- Academic staff members holding **full-time employment** from all disciplines in overseas universities and institutions are welcome to apply.

- The applications **must be endorsed** by the relevant heads of departments/units and faculty deans/directors of institutes to confirm that on-going collaboration in the proposed research area will be supported
