28/20 Approval of agenda

30/20 Information items

1. Assessment forms and obligatory activities, spring 2021

The corona-adapted assessment forms for the spring semester 2021 were approved via e-mail. Student representative commented on the suggested obligatory activities for ENG125, noting that 500 words per week might be a bit much when combined with the other courses at 100-level. The course instructor for ENG125 agrees, and the wordcount for the weekly submissions is reduced to 400 words.

2. Teaching next semester

The schedule for the spring semester will be published on 4 December. The goal is to have as much teaching as possible on campus, but with a hybrid option for students who can not attend in person. The hybrid option will mainly be via Zoom, where the lecturer brings a video tower to class and share their screen with students joining on Zoom. This will be more interactive than using the stream option from the fall semester, and we are a bit more in control of the technology.

Some 200 and 300-level courses have large enough rooms, and we might consider checking whether students are planning on attending class on campus or need a Zoom-option. Hanne will get in touch with each course instructor about the specifics for each course.

3. Redesign

We discussed having a redesign-meeting on 9 December, to decide on how to move forward in the project and make some sort of schedule for next semester. The proposed meeting on 9 December will have to be postponed till January/February.



4. KFK-update

Aud Solbjørg informed about the ongoing KFK (*Kompetanse for kvalitet*) project, where the English section will offer continuing education courses for teachers of English. The four courses are being prepared, and staff members from linguistics, literature/culture and didactics are involved in creating these courses. The course descriptions must be completed by 15 December and 1 March is the application deadline for prospective students.

The financial part of this project is a bit unclear, and it seems to be less lucrative than first indicated. There are two permanent positions advertised for this project, but it is not decided if these are full time positions or part time positions (or a combination).

31/20 Digital study trip to York in week 9 and 10

We usually send around 35 students to The Norwegian Study Centre in York every spring semester, in weeks 9 and 10. The NSC has decided that all short courses are run digitally until Easter. The online offer will be interactive, with social elements and will complement our 100-level courses well. The teachers at the NSC are engaging and the online courses offered in the fall semester have been well received. It is also important to keep this connection with York and maintain the NSC in a very difficult period. The course fee is set to reflect what it costs to send staff members to York.

The program board agrees to "send" students (digitally) to York in the spring semester 2021. Dagmar will select modules and let the NSC know. We will need to think about a good way to inform the students of the "trip" and encourage them to sign up.

32/20 Course revision - ENG347

ENG347 has previously been offered as part of the linguistic courses in the master program. The course was deleted from the program after the spring semester 2017 and was replaced with <u>LING311</u> – offered by the Department of Linguistic, Literary and Aesthetic Studies (LLE).

ENG347 will be included in the master program from fall 2021 and follow the same pattern as the existing courses, that is with a general course description to allow for content to vary depending on course instructor. The 6000-word term paper is reduced to 4000 words to align with other courses with similar assessment forms (ENG332, ENG341, ENG337). LING311 is kept as an elective course in the spring semester and it can replace either ENG345, ENG347 or ENG349.

The necessary changes will be made to the study plan in MAHF-ENG.

Decision

The program board approves the suggested changes to ENG347. A revised course description will be sent to the faculty before the fall 2021 deadline. LING311 continues as an elective course.

33/20 Course revision ENG223L/ENG221L

It was decided in the program board meeting 22 January that we change the numbers of credits we give for ENG221 (History of English) and ENG223L (Modern Linguistics) in the teacher training program. From a 'relevance for work life' perspective, it would make more sense to offer Modern English Linguistics (ENG223) as a 10 ECTs course and History of English (ENG221) as a 5 ECTs course.



As a result, we remove ENG223L from the teacher training program and the course will no longer be offered. Instead, we create and add ENG221L – a five credit version of already existing ENG221. The assessment form for ENG221 is a three-hour school exam.

The necessary changes will be made to the study plan in MAHF-LÆFR.

Decision

The program board approves the suggested changes to the teacher training program: to remove ENG223L and add ENG221L. The course description will be forwarded to UUI.

34/20 Course reports, spring 2020

The following courses from the spring semester 2020 were discussed in the meeting:

Comments meeting:

The shift from on-campus to fully digital teaching in March was hard for everyone and student evaluations showed that while the shift to digital worked fine, most students prefer on-campus teaching.

Course instructor in ENG345 (Craig Grocott) commented that the topic for his version of ENG345 is very relevant for teacher training students and that this was commented on in his class (that did not include L-students). It could be worth considering having this topic (or a similar one) as part of the course offerings for teacher training students (in either ENG339L, ENG341 or ENG343).

35/20 Other business

A course revision of ENGMAU642 (literature) was added to the agenda: the assessment form for ENGMAU642 needs to be revised, as the current 14-day term papers is a bit irregular (and not allowed as an assessment form). It was noted that ENGMAU641 (linguistic) has the same assessment form.

We need to look at the program as a whole and perhaps look to the corresponding NORMAU-program and see what they do. It was decided in the meeting that the three coordinators get together. Suggested changes can be sent to Ingvild Nilssen (student advisor, ENGMAU) as soon as possible.
