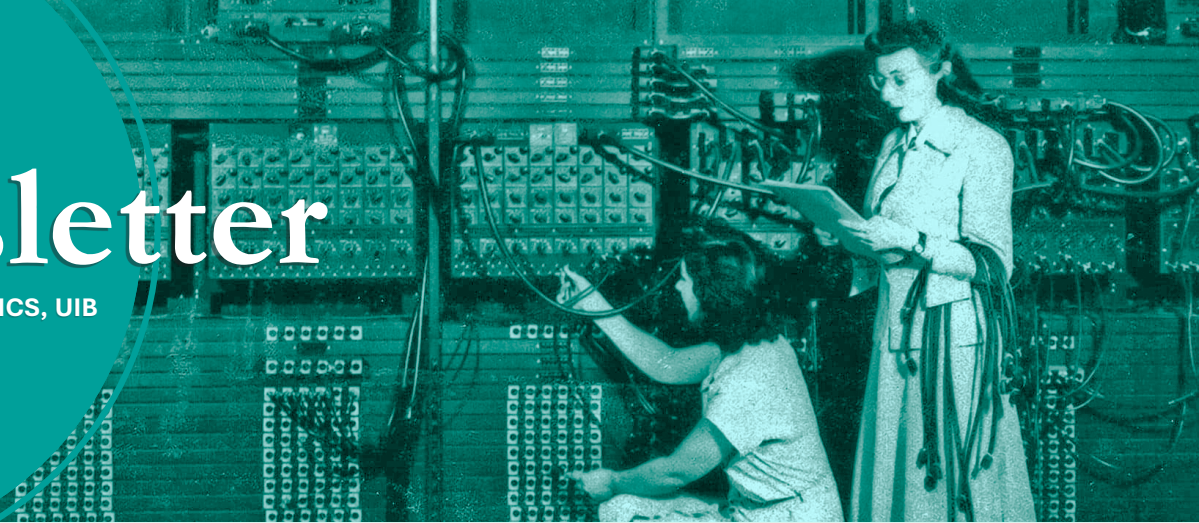

Dear Colleagues,

Webinar: New assessment criteria from RCN - Open science

The Research Council of Norway (RCN) has stated that open research will be incorporated into the assessment criteria for Researcher Projects and Collaborative and Knowledge-building Projects on open science practice. This applies to applications with deadline already February 8th, 2023.

A webinar on January 31st (13.00 CET) from [ELIXIR Norway](#) will provide you with information on Open Data and Data Management requirements for these research applications to the RCN.

For projects funded by the RCN, open science is now one of the assessment criteria and all funded projects must assess the need for a Data Management Plan. In this webinar, we will highlight the RCN requirements for Open Data and Data Management from a Life Science perspective and provide a short introduction to the Data Management Planning tool "Data Stewardship Wizard" by ELIXIR Norway. CRISTin registration of 2022 publications

To all scientific staff at the Department of Informatics!

We kindly remind you to...

- check that all of your 2022-publications are (correctly!) registered in CRISTin*,
- to add missing publications to the system,
- to make sure that a full-text version is uploaded for all research *articles*, and
- to register the project code for publications that are a result of projects funded by the EU, RCN, or other funders that require open access

The deadline for completing those tasks is **31 January 2023**!

General instructions: A publication shall only be reported once. Revised editions shall not be reported. To count as an academic publication, the publication has to fulfill certain criteria (see [here](#) for more information). Furthermore, in order for an institution to count a publication wholly or partially for reporting, the name of the institution must be listed as an author's address in the publication itself.

Please note: The department's budget is partly dependent on the number of publication points generated by our scientific staff's publications. If the full-text version of a research article has not been uploaded to CRISTin, we are not allowed to approve and report the respective publication. Hence, this article will not generate any publication points, having a negative impact on the department's future budget.

Utrecht Network - Young Researcher's

Grant: Up to 20 scholarships of €1,000 each will be offered to students for a short-term mobility. The grant is for thesis research on masters or PhD levels. Students are allowed to take courses as well. However, priority is given to "research-only" students, and it is meant for students who do not qualify for Erasmus+ scholarships.

Since the study/research period including the application is self-organised, students are expected to check possible research areas of the university they want to apply to and to find the supervisor by themselves.

Prerequisites: Minimum length of stay 4 weeks (mobility is not restricted to semesters but may also take place during the holidays). The period of mobility must start between 1 May 2023- 31 March 2024

(FRIPRO): The Research Council of Norway is planning to open a call for funding to give [talented young researchers](#) the opportunity to pursue their ideas and lead a research project. This call is targeting researchers in the early stages of their careers, 2–7 years after their PhD defence, and under the age of 40.

north2north program: North2north is the mobility program in the UArctic network. UiB sends one institutional application for n2n funding.

UiB researchers and students can apply for support for visiting n2n partners. Units that wish to invite employees from North American and Scottish n2n partners can now also apply for support for incoming employees for the academic year 2023 - 2024. You cannot get an n2n scholarship if you already have funding from another mobility program (Erasmus, Norplus, etc.).

Centre for Environment-friendly Energy Research (FME):

The Research Council aims to start up six to ten new centres for environment-friendly energy research in 2024. Only applicants who have submitted a [mandatory project outline](#) by the deadline for outlines (tentative: 10 May 2023) are eligible to apply for funding under the [final application round](#) (tentative: 15 November 2023).



Peder Sather: The Peder Sather Center for Advanced Study supports projects carried out by researchers at UC Berkeley in collaboration with researchers from eight Norwegian universities. The Center offers grants between \$10K and \$25K. Funds are made available for two academic years.

Grants can support activities such as workshops, mini-conferences, virtual intellectual exchanges, the undertaking of exploratory and pilot studies, activities such as PhD student exchanges, longer-term stays for Principal Investigators, the collection and analysis of data, and other core research activities.

ERC AdG: [ERC Advanced Grants](#) are for established, leading principal investigators who seek long-term funding to pursue a ground-breaking, high-risk project.

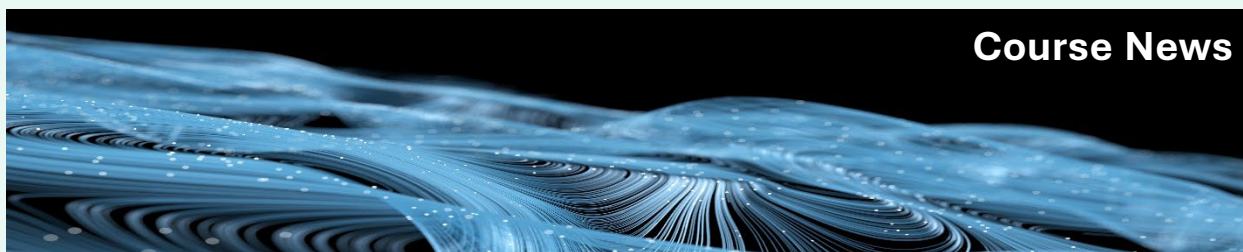
COST: “[COST](#) funds interdisciplinary research networks called COST Actions. These Actions bring together researchers, innovators and other professionals including industry specialists, who are based in Europe and beyond, to collaborate on research topics for a period of 4 years. The funding a COST Action receives covers the expenses of networking activities rather than research and as such is used to organise and fund events, Short-term Scientific Missions, Training Schools, communication activities, and virtual networking tools.”

Open Research

From 2023, **open research will be incorporated into the assessment criteria** for Researcher Projects and Collaborative and Knowledge-building Projects on open science practice. [On this website](#), the RCN explains how you can best respond to these assessment criteria when applying for funding.

New *Success rates*

The Research Council is trying to **increase its success rates for research applications** to 25%. To achieve this, they currently propose two measures (which still have to be approved by the Board):

- Open-ended deadline for calls, but with a waiting period of 12 months after a proposal has been submitted to a certain call.
- Introducing a quarantine for proposals of lower quality (1-2 years).
