### Dear Colleagues,

I write this on my way back from Brussel where the heads of departments as well as the "dean team" of the Science and Technology Faculty have been for a two-days workshop. We had a very interesting program including presentations from people having central roles at different levels involved in EU policy developments, shaping of the framework programs and Norwegian representatives working in Brussel to bridge between their national organization and the EU. Even though I have been in Brussel and at the UiB office here several times, I learnt a lot – and we also had many good discussions among heads of departments and faculty leadership.

One thing that made an impression on me is the close coupling between political decisions in EU and the downstream shaping of the research and innovation support (framework) programs. Research and innovation are seen as key elements by the commission and new political decisions and strategies are reflected in the framework programs and in new calls for proposals, especially in <a href="Pillar Two">Pillar Two</a>. It is important that we have some understanding of how this works. We can engage at different stages in policy and research program development to influence shaping of policy and calls. And finally, we need to see which calls we can respond to:)

Luckily, the European Research Council (ERC) are funding curiosity driven research where the only criterion is excellence. EIC, the innovation council, also have open calls. Charlotte Eide, who is leading the UiB office in Brussel, can offer advice and host meetings in Brussel, for example if you want to gather potential consortium partners from across Europe to discuss a joint proposal.

Contributions or comments to the newsletter are very welcome.

Next week we will have an ad out for a tenure track position in information security at the Selmer center where one requirement is that applicants should be able to get security clearance. The position is linked with a new initiative that we are planning towards information security in space – a collaboration with the Norwegian National Security Authority (NSM) and Simula UiB. Hiring a faculty member with possibility for security clearance enables us to enter into new types of projects. But this does not mean that our new colleague will only work on this type of projects. Our department will remain as open as possible and we will work out what extra measures might be needed as projects and activities develop.

We are still waiting for the results of the EVALMIT assessment, the latest I heard is

that we may expect results towards the end of March. In the meantime, make sure to follow and engage in the upcoming elections (see page 4)!



- 100 million kroner for follow-up of subject evaluations


