Dear Colleagues,

The change of government in the USA is affecting the world in many ways, including academic freedom and human rights. The government is closing down funding programs and our colleagues in the US fear for their jobs and ability to perform research and research-based education. It is important that we stand up for academic and human rights. These are fundamental for modern democracy.

Today I am at a <u>UiB AI seminar</u>, and the role of AI in this picture and our responsibility as experts in AI and informatics is on the agenda. I would recommend watching the video from this seminar – available on the web site. In the break we will also mark the <u>Stand Up for Science</u> – linked with the main event in Washington DC and across USA and the world. I hope you will all engage!

I know this is a busy time of the year in terms of teaching, I hope you also have to prepare and submit applications for research funding. After a couple of years with fewer relevant calls, there are now several open calls from the Research Council of Norway that I would like you to consider carefully. First, there is a call for research projects towards ICT where the chances are extra

good this year. In addition, the portfolio for ground-breaking research (that includes FRIPRO and SFF) recently got half a billion extra in funding and are launching new types of calls - including seed funding for radical ideas and top researcher projects with up to 40 million NOK per project (more details here). The extra funds will also be used for network projects and research schools to follow up the recommendations in the national assessments performed by the research (EVALMIT, EVALBIOVIT, EVALNAT and EVALMEDHELSE). This could also present opportunities for us to strengthen national and international collaboration and given the strength of our research groups,

our department should aim to lead several such networks and research schools!
