### Dear Colleagues,

May is a month with lots of public holidays, and since it is also often a month with good weather, I hope you have the opportunity to take some time off work and re-charge your batteries before the final busy period this side of summer!

This week, I partook in a science seminar organized with Stortinget, the Norwegian parliament. The topic was artificial intelligence within health, and around 20 members of parliament took part. There is a lot of attention on artificial intelligence these days – after ChatGPT, Dall-E and an avalanche of other apps have been made available to the general public. People in the street, and members of parliament, have a limited understanding of the technology. There is also need for a public debate on AI, the possibilities it creates and the threats it poses. Europe is developing regulations around AI, and Norway is taking some steps as well.

Because the technology and applications are developing so quickly, there is a need for some urgency. Hence, I was happy when we could use NORA to put together a "fagseminar" (scientific seminar) with the Norwegian parliament. I do hope we will have a knowledge-based and productive process to put in place the appropriate regulations and to strengthen Norway's possibilities to develop and use AI in a good way in the coming years and decades. Several people among our staff have already contributed to spreading knowledge around AI through media etc., and I do hope several more will engage going forward. This is also an opportunity for us

to bring more attention to informatics and the importance of our research and educational activities.


## Recycling centre
