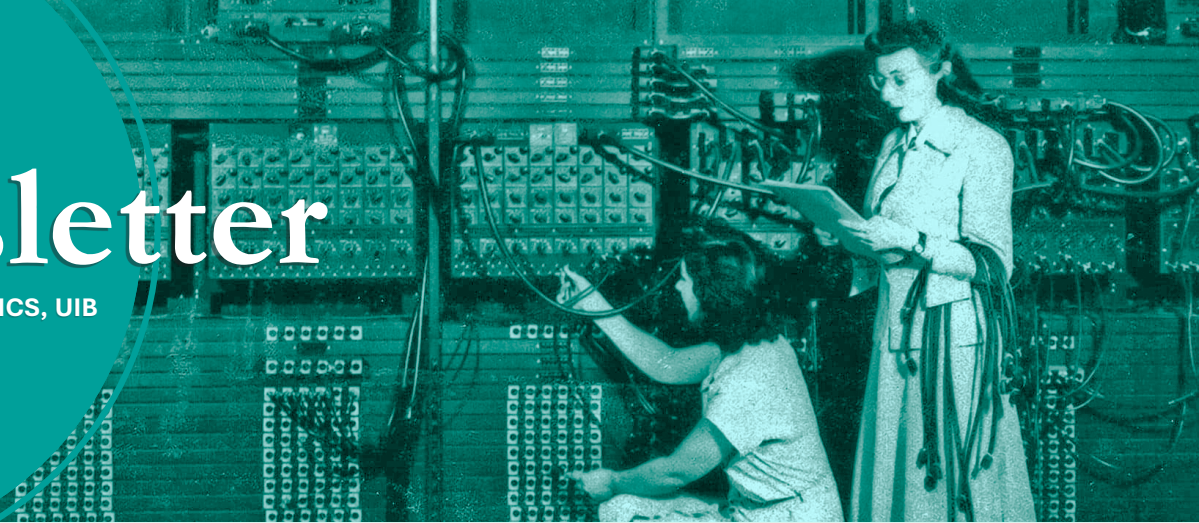

Dear Colleagues,

This week I have been taking part in [Arendalsuka](#) – an event bringing together leaders from academia, industry, government, and politics – with numerous seminars and panel debates. Maybe the most popular topic – the subject of over 100 events and mentioned in far more – is Artificial Intelligence. The level of understanding of AI is highly variable, but has improved since last year according to colleagues who attended then as well. I look forward to a new semester, and to working with all of you who are engaged in providing our students with the best possible education – all while doing cutting edge research in informatics.

The meeting was very relevant for our teaching, too: some of the novel JavaScript features which were [discussed during the meeting](#) will be covered this year in INF214 lectures.”

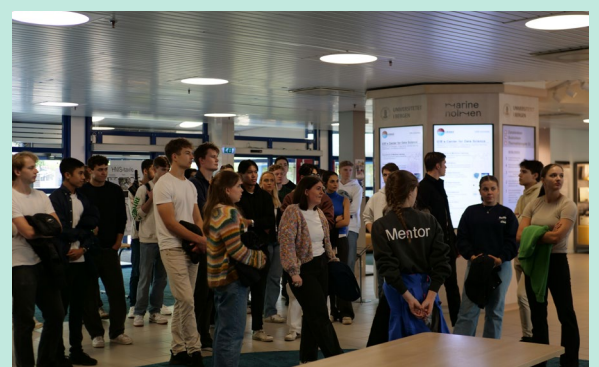

It is anticipated that there will be an info meeting in September, and that the calls will open in October (see the timeline in the calls). These calls will have no explicit submission deadline. Please also note the new criteria regarding waiting period after submission and quarantine depending on the evaluation score. In addition, there are new eligibility criteria for the applicant PI as well as restrictions for researchers who have an ongoing FRIPRO project.

Application deadline: open-ended (to be opened in October)



Update CAS project: “The Centre for Advanced Study (CAS) invites researchers to pursue excellent, fundamental, curiosity-driven research in Oslo for one academic year. Assemble your international dream team of prominent researchers and apply for [a research stay at CAS](#).”

Only faculty members who hold permanent, full-time, tenured academic positions at CAS' partner institutions in Norway are eligible to apply. The applicants will function as principal investigator (PI) and will assemble and lead their research group at CAS.”

Application deadline: 18 October 2023

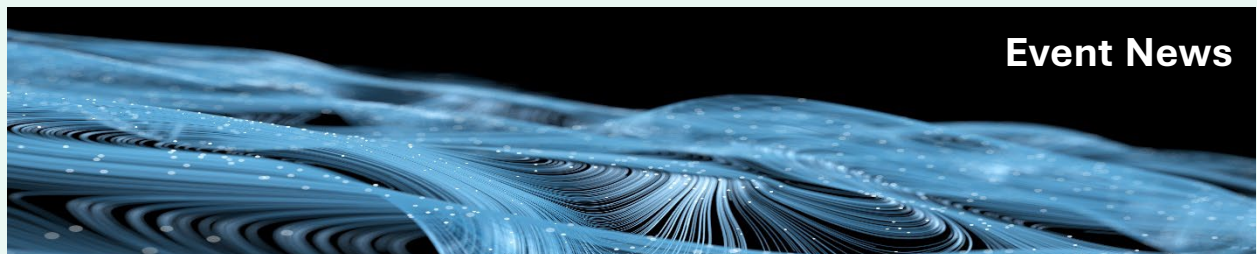

Course description

The course will introduce bioinformatic approaches, tools and pipelines for computational analyses of Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) data. Focus will be on analysis methods for coding and non-coding RNA from RNA-seq, and transcription factors and epigenetic markers from ChIP-Seq. The course will cover strategies, methods and workflows used for analyses of such data, including mapping to reference genomes, feature extraction, and statistical analysis.

Workshop description

In this workshop, we will cover the technical principles of genome assembly, annotation, and genome comparison. We will explore the techniques related to genome sequencing, the software and strategies used for genome assembly and annotation. Following that, we will delve into comparative genomics, focusing on fundamental concepts such as genomic structural features (transposable elements, genes, centromeres), orthologs, and functional characterization of genes. Through this, participants will gain the necessary skills to test hypotheses in the field of comparative genomics.
