Dear Colleagues,

As many of you already know, we got a positive message from the European Commission this summer that the project LEAD Al got funded! LEAD AI is funded by the COFUND program, which is part of Horison Europe's Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions. LEAD AI involves the training of 19 postdoctoral fellows across UiB in the period 2024-2028, as well as help to promote institutional change and cutting-edge research on AI. The opportunities range from basic AI research for the relevant disciplines to more applied research in the natural sciences and medicine, as well as issues such as the interaction between AI, people and society with legal and ethical challenges. Our department will play a central role in this project, reflecting the central role of informatics within AI. We will host several of the postdocs, and the project is organizationally placed at our department. LEAD AI is an excellent opportunity for us to recruit and train talented researchers and to contribute to further strengthening our research activities in this area. I really look forward to this exciting project!

There is another important activity linked with work environment, focusing particularly on

diversity, gender balance and equality: Last autumn we developed an action plan for the department, in which an important task was to do an investigation of the situation locally. Many of you contributed to developing questions for a survey during the HSE (Health, Safety, Environment) session at the department meeting at Voss in April. The working group for gender balance has now finalized the survey. It is really important for us to get as good an understanding as we possibly can, and I encourage all staff to fill in the survey. We hope this will help us direct further work linked with gender equality and balance - so

please do fill it in when it arrives in your mailbox shortly!

The conference provides opportunities for meeting colleges, building networks, and publishing scientific work. Accepted papers give credits (level 1) in the Cristin system.

Sabbatical: All at least 50%, permanently employed professors and associate professors can apply for a <u>sabbatical</u> and, if relevant, related travel funds.



Informatics: The <u>TMS Starting Grant</u> programme is a highly competitive and prestigious funding mechanism designed to help UiB in recruiting and/or retaining talented young researchers. The application process has several stages, starting with the nomination of applicants by the department (and faculty). We ask all research groups to send their suggestions for applicants to the head of department, who will select up to two candidates that will get the opportunity to apply for a TMS Starting Grant the following year (2024).

UiB Global Challenges: UiB has issued a <u>call</u> within its strategic area "Global Challenges". 

Course description

The course will introduce bioinformatic approaches, tools and pipelines for computational analyses of Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) data. Focus will be on analysis methods for coding and non-coding RNA from RNA-seq, and transcription factors and epigenetic markers from ChIP-Seq. The course will cover strategies, methods and workflows used for analyses of such data, including mapping to reference genomes, feature extraction, and statistical analysis.

Workshop description

In this workshop, we will cover the technical principles of genome assembly, annotation, and genome comparison. We will explore the techniques related to genome sequencing, the software and strategies used for genome assembly and annotation. Following that, we will delve into comparative genomics, focusing on fundamental concepts such as genomic structural features (transposable elements, genes, centromeres), orthologs, and functional characterization of genes. Through this, participants will gain the necessary skills to test hypotheses in the field of comparative genomics.
