Dear Colleagues,

Recruiting new faculty - professors and associate professors - is of high importance for the department. They are the ones to lead the research and educational activities in the years and decades to come. So it is of critical importance to recruit excellent new members of staff. Last week, we interviewed two applicants for a position in information security and I hope that we will be able to send out an offer of employment soon. Next week, we are interviewing two applicants for a position in the Visualisation group. A third applicant will be interviewed towards the end of October. I do hope that many of you will prioritize attending the trial lectures next week (Monday from 10:15 and Friday from 12:15, more details later in this newsletter and on email). We have very well qualified applicants and I think everybody should take the opportunity to meet them - and it is also important that the applicants get a good impression of potential future colleagues!

There has been a lot of attention around quantum technology the last months. The Research council already had multiple calls for projects and centers in this direction, the government has initiated a quantum strategy and just announced that they will increase their investments by 750MNOK the next ten years. This is following increasing investments globally including on the European level as well as in Denmark and Sweden. At our faculty, we are planning an initiative towards quantum technology

with the Department of Physics and Technology and our department playing the most important roles. There is no plan to make a new research group in this direction at our department, but multiple groups may contribute and there is a possibility of getting new resources that will help to strengthen the existing groups.

As has been said many times, the rapid developments within AI technologies are affecting us in many ways. The faculty has developed a nomenclature for use of AI. It is up to us to define for each course – and for master theses – what use of AI we will accept and how this should be reported etc. We had "teachers meetings" around this and we plan to follow up on this in a collective fashion this autum. It is clear to me that our students need to learn the craft and art of coding (and writing) and the basics are best taught without using AI. But we should also explore how we can train our students to use AI in a proficient way to

produce high quality code (and text) in an efficient way. Both for their studies and for their careers.




