Dear Colleagues,

Last week we celebrated the department turning 40 years – and my impression from talking with quite a few people is that I am not the only one who enjoyed the event! It was particularly inspiring to see the presentations from previous students who talked about their current roles and about how the education they got here prepared them for careers both inside and outside academia. It illustrated that the most important output from our department is all the candidates we educate who go out and do important jobs for society.

That society needs our candidates is also recognized by the government who propose to allocate 100 new study places in ICT across the country. Ten of these will be at UiB and now we know that five will end up at our department. A study place comes with funding – and an expectation of the candidate finishing a degree. We are lucky to have more applicants to our programs than study places, and in order to maintain this situation it is of course important to maintain the level of quality in our studies and to communicate to potential students (and society) that we offer exciting studies which open up a range of career opportunities.

This week we did the interview for the EVALMIT evaluation. We were five people taking part from the department answering mostly questions already communicated to us a few weeks

back. The committee was well prepared, and we had an interesting exchange on among other things how to recruit the best talents and how to balance staff time used for education and research. It will be interesting to see the outcome of the evaluation. They will summarize their assessment and recommendations at a national level as well as at department and research groups level. For us at the department, the last two will be of particular importance. The national report can also be interesting and help inform strategies at the department level, but more importantly at an institutional and national level.

Yesterday I was at a meeting with the faculty where all Centre of Excellence (SFF) initiatives, aiming for the call coming out next year, were invited to present. There was a wide variety of initiatives and the one from the CBU/Michael Sars Centre was the one closest to us. It is still possible to come forward with new initiatives. Also, several

of those presenting were open for discussions with groups at our department.

Course description:

Software Carpentry aims to help researchers get their work done in less time and with less pain by teaching them basic research computing skills. This course will cover the following lessons:

- UNIX Shell: Learn to use the terminal to handle a large amount of files more efficiently and other useful skills which can support basic programming skills
- R for reproducible scientific analysis: R is normally described as a useful programming language used as a tool for statistical analyses, but can also do much more.*
- Plotting and Programming in Python: Python is the most ubiquitous programming languages of today and is a typical first language taught for beginners.*

- Using Databases and SQL:With SQL, you will learn to handle and index large amounts of data
- Version Control with Git: Share files with your peers more efficiently, and learn to "travel back in time" to previous versions of your own code with Git
- Research Data Management (RDM): We are all dealing with data in our research. This module is about organizing, storing, and sharing research data effectively, with a focus on Findability, Accessibility, Interoperability, and Reproducibility (FAIR).
- * Please take note that these two modules will be run in parallell, and learners will have to choose which module to attend.
