LETTER FROM INGE

Dear colleagues,

Today I had the pleasure of meeting with the new main board of echo — the informatics student organization!

A continued strong collaboration with echo is of great importance to the department. Our student body makes up around a quarter of the faculty's total, and echo plays a vital role in recruiting and retaining students, contributing to a truly "sticky campus."

Organizing more than 200 events each year and involving over 100 students in the organization itself, echo does a lot for our students — things we wouldn't be able to manage on our own. So, hurra for Echo!

After many years of increasing interest in informatics studies in Norway, we're seeing a decline in applications this year. Nationally, the number of applicants has dropped by 22% when considering each applicant's top-priority program (see the press release).

For our study programs, the "datateknologi" program has a decrease at this level, while the other programs have a considerably smaller decrease so that the overall fall is less than 10% for our bachelor and siving programs. At the master level, we have an increase in applications.

These changes may reflect a slightly less heated job market, which naturally fluctuates over time. That said, I firmly believe there will be a continued and growing demand for IT experts with strong theoretical foundations in the years ahead. AI will not replace the most complex and critical aspects of software development — the experts we educate will be more essential than ever!

The exam season is now at its peak, and thankfully it comes with a stretch of beautiful weather! I hope you find some time to enjoy the sunshine and perhaps some warmth. I also hope you get the chance to take part in the celebration of Norwegian Constitution Day — the 17th of May!

DEANS BLOG: INCREASED APPLICANT NUMBERS

This is a summary of the latest post from the Deans Blog.

Steady Interest, Smart Campaigns, and a Few Worries for the Future

The Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (NT) saw a small but solid 1% rise in first-choice applicants—holding steady over six years. A clever campaign with Q-Meieriene, funny videos, and student ambassadors led to 10 million views and 48,000 clicks on the facultys website.

Nationally, STEM interest is slipping (IT down 22%), but the faculty had highlights: the new MSc in Geophysics tripled its spots in applicants, and programs like Geology and Marine Technology also stood out. Master's applications rose 7%.

Now open Research Council of Norway – Radical Research Ideas for Early Career

Scientists: This call is aimed at early career researchers (2-7 years after PhD) who want to test particularly bold research ideas.

"The purpose of this call is to fund curiosity-driven and bold research that can contribute to advancing the state-of-the-art. This call is the first step in phased funding and is aimed at researchers who want to test particularly bold research ideas. The ideas must be so bold that the risk of failure is too high to justify starting a large project, but where the research could have a significant impact on the field if the project is successful. Project managers for successful research idea projects may later apply for larger FRIPRO projects and be prioritized there."

Application deadline: open-ended

Now open Research Council of Norway – Top Researchers: Researcher Projects to Develop World Leading Research

Communities: This call will

support projects where
collaboration between two or
more researchers is a prerequisite
for achieving the project's
research objectives. "The purpose
of this call is to fund curiositydriven and bold research that can

contribute to advancing the state-of-the-art. This call aims to give good, Norwegian research environments the opportunity to develop into being world-leading within their fields." It is expected that project leaders will, later on, also apply for an ERC grant.

Application deadline: open-ended





cost: "Cost funds interdisciplinary research networks called Cost Actions. These Actions bring together researchers, innovators and other professionals including industry specialists, who are based in Europe and beyond, to collaborate on research topics for a period of 4 years. The funding a Cost Action receives covers the expenses of networking activities rather than research. As such is used to organise and fund events, Short-term Scientific Missions, Training Schools, communication activities, grants to attend interesting international conferences, and virtual networking tools."

Application deadline: 21 October 2025

New Research Council of Norway – Center for Quantum Technology Research: "The purpose of this announcement is to build strong Norwegian research communities at a high international level within quantum computing, quantum sensors, and quantum communication."

Application deadline: 24 September (tentative)

New Research Council of Norway – Research Infrastructures of National Importance: The published information is still preliminary. The announcement will most likely be divided into two parts: Part 1 will be aimed at named research infrastructures with particular strategic importance for Norway. Part 2 will be open to all other research infrastructures.

Application deadline: 12 November (tentative)

EU - MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships (PFs): "The objective of PFs is to support researchers' careers and foster excellence in research. The Postdoctoral Fellowships action targets researchers holding a PhD who wish to carry out their research activities abroad, acquire new skills and develop their careers. PFs help researchers gain experience in other countries, disciplines and non-academic sectors."

Application deadline: 10 September 2025

Research Council of Norway – Norwegian Centres of Excellence (SFF, stage 1): "The

SFF scheme gives Norway's leading scientific communities the opportunity to organize themselves into centers to achieve ambitious scientific goals through collaboration and long-term basic funding. The research at the centers should be innovative and have great potential for groundbreaking results that advance the international research frontier. The centers should work with ambitious ideas and complex problems where coordinated and long-term research e\orts within or across disciplines are important to achieve the goals." Centres are funded for up to ten years (six + four years).

Application deadline: 12 November (tentative)

Research Council of Norway – Support for events: You can apply for <u>funding to organize</u>

conferences, workshops and seminars. NB: There is no funding left for events within ICT.

Research Council of Norway – ICT research:

The Research Council of Norway has a call for Researcher Project for ICT Renewal and Development. «The purpose of this call is to promote innovation and development in research that can contribute to advancing the international research front in ICT, including digital security and sovereignty, the next generation of data processing/ICT systems and other ICT research areas.»

Application deadline: open-ended

Stay tuned CAS Research Grant: "All faculty members who hold permanent, full-time, tenured academic positions at CAS' partner institutions can apply for a CAS Research Grant and receive funding for a one-year stay at the Centre together with their handpicked team of internationally renowned researchers. [...] The project should be a contribution to basic research, blue-sky, challenge given truths and have the potential to advance the research frontier in the relevant field(s). Scholars in all fields can apply but note that laboratory-based research is not possible at CAS."

Application deadline: The next call will be announced in June 2025.

New Abel Prize: "The Abel Prize recognises pioneering scientific achievements in mathematics. [...] The right to nominate is open to anyone. Nominations are confidential and a nomination should not be made known to the nominee. The prize can be awarded to a single person or shared for closely related fundamental contributions."

Application deadline: 1 September
