Travel suggestions: To and from Bergen there are daily direct international flights via Copenhagen (Scandinavian Airlines System), Amsterdam (KLM), Berlin (Norwegian) or Aberdeen and Hamburg (Widerøe).

Before and after the conference you could include the one day round trip from Bergen "Norway in a Nutshell", leaving from the train station in Bergen typically at 8:00, or the 7-day postal ship cruise with Hurtigruten from Bergen to Kirkenes (near the Russian border), passing the polar circle (leaving at Sydnes Bergen port at 20:00 hrs every evening - early booking needed!) (https://www.hurtigruten.no/), or, e.g. flights to the stunning Lofoten islands.

At Bergen, The international music festival is on from 22d of May $-4^{\rm th}$ of June, thus a few days in Bergen may be worthwhile. See the program here: https://www.fib.no/en/. We will reserve a few hotel rooms one day before and after the conference because Bergen is one of the key European travel destinations in May and June. However, you should inform us early enough, so that we can handle and detail these reservations.

The venue for the conference, Solstrand Hotel & Bad, is one of the most beautiful historic resorts in the European north, located at the Bjørnefjord leading into the world famous Hardangerfjord with orchards (blossoming in late May) in the valley and glaciers on the mountain tops. If you plan for a longer stay there, very early personal reservations are required. See http://solstrand.com/en.

The driving distance to Bergen City or Flesland airport is about 40 minutes. For visiting Bergen, however, we recommend taking a city hotel. Please contact us as soon as possible if you want us to reserve hotel for you in Bergen or extra stay at Solstrand. Due to the music festival, it might get difficult to obtain hotels at a later stage.
