Presently it says in the Norwegian version of the course description that the course has 8 "hjemmeoppgaver." In this context it is used to describe obligatory assignments. But the term "hjemmeoppgave" is often associated with a form of final exam. Should we change the phrasing to "obligatoriske oppgaver" instead so that it becomes clearer that this is an obligatory assignment, and not an exam?
