### 4. Discussion

a) MA thesis: should we add specifications of word count and font to the already existing page number on Mi Side?

Haugland pointed out that the guidelines on format for the MA side are already on Mi Side (MAHF-ENG). They are as follows:

#### 1. Format and content

- The thesis should have a length between 70 and 110 pages. This does not include front cover, index, preface, bibliography and appendix.
- Margins: normal; line spacing: one and a half (some subject areas double line spacing); size of letters: 12 for fonts Times, Times New Roman, 11 for Arial.
- The thesis should be written in the same foreign language as the student's master's programme; English, French, Italian, Spanish or German. In the master's programmes of Arabic and Russian the thesis is normally written in Norwegian, Swedish, Danish or English. To use another language than described here, you need to send an application for approval by the Department of Foreign Languages.
- Content of the front cover: Title of the thesis, your name, department/subject, semester and the logo of UiB (cf. point. 6).
- Each of the main chapters of the thesis is to start on a new page.

A problem might rise when students use a lot of graphics in their thesis, and we might therefore still want to specify the required number of words it should include.

b) Sending MA theses to Oslo for printing has been the practice for a couple of years now, and the exam consultant thinks it makes the process not only slower, but also more expensive and less environmentally friendly. The Board is asked to have an opinion.

We decided to write a letter of complaint to the Departmental Board, and expressing our desire to use a local printer.
