

According to Norwegian law, tuberculosis examination is mandatory for persons from countries where tuberculosis is common.

The examination consists of a chest x-ray for adults and a blood test for children. It is also important that persons without legal residency in Norway are examined for tuberculosis. Test results that indicate tuberculosis infection will not have negative consequences for work or resident permit applications. All information is handled with confidentiality.

Symptoms of tuberculosis

- Chronic cough, >3 weeks
- Night sweats
- Weight loss
- Feeling weak and tired
- Swelling or lump in your neck, groin or under your arms.

If you have tuberculosis, you will be treated free of charge in Norway. You will be entitled to remain in Norway until you have completed the treatment.
