#### **STATEMENT OF TEACHING PHILOSOPHY**

As a teacher of Latin American literature and culture, my goal is to help students learn specific cultural content, as well as general and communicative competences in Spanish. I believe that foreign language programs should foster and sustain **continued progress** not only in the teaching of theoretical content but also in the development of language proficiency throughout the student's career. More specifically, I maintain that **curriculum design should aim to fulfill the needs of students**, enabling them to function successfully in a Spanish-language academic context as well as in everyday Spanish-language environments. Also, I have always been a supporter of student exchange programs (both for **study abroad and internships abroad**). The first-hand exploration of Hispanic language and culture provided by an immersion program creates a unique learning experience.
