Teaching is a privileged task, gives pleasure, is obviously useful and requires our full efforts. Without students, our workplace would not exist. In addition, we get to teach the topnotch of students!

EEA grants/Norway Grants - What's in for me and is it relevant to Horizon 2020?

The Donor States Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein have now announced collaborative research programmes with three European countries (Beneficiary States): Romania and Czech Republic; the announcements for Hungary and Latvia are coming soon.

Research projects in priority areas like Health and Food Safety or interdisciplinary projects are supported up to three years. Common to all programmes is that the projects are sought, led and administered by the Beneficiary States. All programmes focus on knowledge transfer, sustainable bilateral cooperation and researcher mobility, and costs incurred are reimbursed 100 %.

It is important to identify good partners who are interesting also with respect to possible applications to Horizon 2020. Having an Eastern European country as partner can be a plus when the partner has potential and key expertise Read more here.



The Lab Animal Facility organizes a conference on ethical evaluation of animal experiments

The Lab Animal Facility organizes the conference *The Bergen conference on Harm-Benefit Analysis of Animal Studies* April 29 2014.

Harm-benefit analysis must now be assessed in every project description when applying for permission to do animal experiments. Animals have an intrinsic value, and this is anchored in national and international legislation. Assessment of social benefits versus harm to the animal is the core of ethical evaluation of animal experiments.

The conference will focus on tools to perform such ethical evaluations.

Helse Bergen with best reputation in Western Norway

The Western Norwegians are more satisfied with their hospitals than last year. Best results has Helse Bergen.

Helse Vest had done a reputation survey in October 2013. Almost 2000 people in the region were asked to score the hospital services where they live.

On a scale from one to five, the total score is 3,9. This is up from 3,7 last year.

The reputation of the bigger hospitals is in large better than that of the smaller ones. People using Helse Bergen are most happy with the services. Helse Bergen is Haukeland University Hospital and Voss hospital. Here the average score is 4,1 out of 5 possible, while Helse Fonna gets 3,8 and Helse Førde 3,3.

Holiday registration and transfer of days


Remember to register used and planned holidays in Pagaweb. You can apply for transfer of maximum 14 days to next year.
