# DIFFERENTIATION STUDIES

- **Differentiation** refers to the varying institutional rules applicable to each state participating in EU arrangements.
- **Positive external differentiation** studies diverging degrees of applicability of institutional rules to each state that engages in EU arrangements.
- **Segmentation** analyses structural characteristics that, by reproducing themselves repeat certain routines and the viability of future pathways over alternative ones.
